Uncontrollable items that impacted the budget and tax increases

- The SU assessment increased 82.5% this year from \$251,108 to \$458,217
- Insurance increased 12%; Contractural raises increased 4.7%; Inflation up 3.5%
- The funding formula mechanism changed significantly this year to a statewide CLA along with adjustments to the yield to meet the ed fund needs impacted tax rates

Surplus Fund Balance = \$121,319.00 *Unaudited*

There was a fund balance of \$121,319.00, which was applied in full to revenues to offset tax increases.

What's Going On at Readsboro School?

Readsboro School continues to be a warm, welcoming, and supportive environment where students thrive both academically and emotionally. This year, we've made several key improvements to enhance learning, student well-being, and overall school operations:

- Clear Leadership Roles The roles of the School Board, Superintendent, and Principal have been clearly defined to support smooth decision-making and effective leadership.
- Transportation Savings We amended bus routes based on ridership needs,
 eliminating an under-utilized bus route and saving the school \$34,529 per year.
- Fiscal Responsibility The school Board approved a line of credit note from M&T Bank in the amount of \$275,000 for the FY24/25 school year to support our financial planning and budgeting.
- **Enhanced Academic Support** We strengthened our Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS) to focus more on intervention, ensuring that all students participate in math groups for dedicated intervention or enrichment time.
- Social-Emotional Learning Our School Counselor is implementing Zones of Regulation, a curriculum that helps students develop self-awareness, emotional regulation, and problem-solving skills, fostering a more inclusive and supportive school environment.
- **Student Safety and Community Access** We've continued our collaboration with the SU Facilities Manager to enhance student safety and improve access to the town library.

The **Zones of Regulation** curriculum has been used in schools worldwide for over 15 years to help students build essential social-emotional skills. By providing a common language for emotional understanding and problem-solving, this program allows more time for learning and less time spent on behavior management, contributing to a positive school culture.

As always, we remain committed to making Readsboro School a place where every student and staff member feels like part of a family.

Facility Maintenance Updates

Over the past year, we've continued to invest in maintaining and improving our school building to ensure a safe, comfortable, and welcoming environment for everyone. Some of the key updates include:

- Enhanced climate control We upgraded our heating controls, allowing for webbased temperature monitoring in classrooms and school spaces, along with realtime alerts for any issues.
- **Strengthened security** We installed 13 new security cameras with 24-hour remote access and replaced door contacts to enhance building safety.
- **Campus upkeep** We removed trees as part of our ongoing efforts to maintain and beautify our school grounds.
